Safeguarding

The choir has an established policy relating to safeguarding children and vulnerable adults. Its safeguarding responsibilities also cover the members of the choir itself.

Safeguarding is the process of protecting people from harm, whether that is occasioned by accident, deliberate abuse, neglect, discrimination, or prejudice. Its purpose is to create a safe and secure environment, ensuring that all choir members obtain the best possible experience from their membership. Choir members have the right to expect such protection.

In the case of any breach of such a right, the choir member should bring the offending behaviour and the nature of the harm occasioned to the attention of the Executive Committee in accordance with the arrangements set out in the Complaints Policy. The Executive Committee will act under the procedures and responsibilities set out in that policy.
